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### JPI CULTURAL HERITAGE

20 Countries and 6 Observers have jointly adopted on cultural heritage research since 2010: i) the Vision Document, ii) a Strategic Research Agenda (SRA), iii) joint actions.

It is a bottom up action among National Ministries, Agencies and Foundations to pool national research efforts in order to avoid duplication and fragmentation for a better use of EU Member States and Associated Countries' public R&I resources.



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

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### **VISION DOCUMENT: 3 CHALLENGES**

<u>Challenge 1</u> probes the relation between cultural heritage and one of the most serious drivers of <u>future change</u> for communities - <u>climate change</u>

<u>Challenge 2</u> probes the issues of protection and security of

cultural heritage

<u>Challenge 3</u> probes the relation between the *protection* of cultural heritage and the *uses of cultural heritage by society* i.e. the transformational challenge of cultural heritage

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### **DEVELOPING A REFLECTIVE SOCIETY**

- to investigate approaches for protecting cultural landscapes, seascapes and heritage, and the safeguarding of their associated intangible expressions (for example, crafts, trades, oral histories, song, etc);
- to examine the consequence for cultural heritage of demographic changes as well as changes due to conflict or rapid development.

### **Protection through use**

revitalisation and regeneration of artefacts, buildings and landscapes taking into account the values

### Sustainability

➤ to develop sustainability strategies, including cultural, social, economic and environmental approaches, for cultural heritage at all scales, from artefact to landscape.

### **Security**

➤ to ensure that management strategies are developed to secure cultural heritage in all its forms.

### Change

changes and their consequences for heritage objects, sites or landscape (material decay/ modelling).

#### Methods and measurements

- non-invasive, remote, imaging and non-destructive measurement and testing methods
- environmental assessment and monitoring technologies.

### **Integrating risks**

risk assessment methodologies and protocols for efficient and responsible management of heritage.

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### SAFEGUARDING OUR CULTURAL HERITAGE RESOURCE

#### Conservation

development of materials, technologies and procedures for long-term maintenance, conservation and in-situ preservation of cultural heritage

### Adaptation and mitigation

- understand material, site and structural change in the context of different environments and global change.
- mitigate the effects of climate change on all forms of cultural heritage, taking into account the values it holds for people and respecting its historic integrity.

- Research on the role of cultural heritage in the reconstruction of (national) identity in post-conflict situations

### **Conservation and Sustainability**

- Development of preservation and accessibility of monuments and sites
- Preservation of landscapes: landscape with its cultural heritage and natural environment
- Creating environmental, cultural, social and economic assets on cultural heritage
- Community as actor in heritage management and sustainable development of local communities





### THE FUTURE: PRIORITY THEMES

### **Regeneration of Historic Sites**

- Re-use and continued use of buildings, historic urban centres and landscapes
- Changing urban landscapes
- Energy efficiency and management for historical buildings
- Sharing knowledge of conservation and adaptation measures for historical buildings in areas that are sensitive for natural risks (i.e. flood, coastal erosion, landslides, earthquakes.....)

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### POLICIES FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE

The Joint Communication underlines the central role of Cultural Heritage and Culture in diplomacy:

- •Supporting culture as an engine for sustainable social and economic development: cultural policies; cultural and creative industries; role of local authorities
- •Promoting culture and intercultural dialogue for peaceful intercommunity relations: cooperation amongst cultural operators; peace-building through Inter-Cultural Dialogue
- •Reinforcing cooperation on Cultural Heritage: research on Cultural Heritage; combat trafficking of heritage; heritage protection

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
