Federparchi provides services and expertise, promotes nature conservation actions also through system projects for the Alps, the Apennines, the coast and islands. It enhances applied scientific research activities, the definition of adequate instruments for environmental safeguard and the involvement of local population for its sustainable development.

Federparchi develops EU projects with several partners particularly focusing on sustainable tourism. It is also engaged in the elaboration of cooperation initiatives for developing countries. Thus, Federparchi collaborates with management bodies in administrative and technical organisation, research, territorial planning and promotion activities. It also contributes to national and local policies with proposals, programmes, projects and initiatives aimed at developing a general action of territorial and environmental management compatible with conservation and sustainable development.

EUROPARC Federation

EUROPARC Federation is an association registered in Germany, counts with 8 sections and represents hundreds of responsible authorities and thousands of Protected Areas in 40 countries of Europe. It is recognised around the world as a professional network of European Protected Areas providing a forum to share professional experience, collaborate on technical projects and progress common aims. Under the emblem "nature knows no boundaries", EUROPARC

Federation facilitates international co-operation in all aspects of Protected Area management to improve and conserve our shared natural and cultural heritage.

Composed by 15 staff members, the Federation's headquarters are located in Regensburg, Germany, and it counts with one additional office in Brussels (Belgium), dedicated to policy and representation of the network interests at European level, and one technical office in Collserola Nature Park, Barcelona (Spain).

EUROPARC is responsible for the creation and implementation of 3 main programmes in Europe:

• the European Charter for Sustainable Tourism in Protected Areas, a practical management tool that enables Protected Areas to develop tourism sustainably and that counts with more than one hundred destinations adhered to the network;

• the Junior Ranger and Youth+ programme, aiming to involve youngsters of Europe in Protected Area management and put them at the centre of decision making on nature conservation;

• the Transboundary Parks Programme, which seeks to support a process of mutual understanding and develop management tools to enable cross border cooperation between Parks separated by political boundaries.

Apart from the permanent programmes, EUROPARC is currently developing specific projects to: build capacity of Protected Area and Natura 2000 managers, create innovative models that empower Protected Areas to become catalysts of a sustainable rural development and core actors in climate change mitigation and adaptation. In addition, EUROPARC Federation counts with different expert commissions conformed by members that work together to address different needs on a variety of topics such as Natura 2000 network, Agriculture in Protected Areas, Health and Protected Areas, Climate Change and Periurban Parks, among others. Regional Park of the Po Delta, Italy

The park protects the largest complex of wetlands in Italy, and one of the most important wildlife sanctuaries in Europe as regards a multitude of nesting, migratory and wintering water birds... <u>Watch teaser online</u>.



Alto Appennino Modenese Regional Park, Italy

The park protects the whole Apennine crest of the area around Modena, with its imposing ridges and peaks of over 2.000 m, which culminate with Mount Cimone (2.165 m), the highest of the Northern Apennines... Watch teaser online.



Appennino Tosco Emiliano National Park, Italy

The vast protected area between Emilia and Tuscany covers most of Reggio's mountains and includes the imposing ranges of Prado, Cusna and Alpe di Succiso that are over 2,000 m high... <u>Watch teaser online.</u>
