Regional Development Centre Koper, Slovenia

Regional Development Centre Koper (RDC Koper) was established in 1994 as an institution at regional level. It performs the role of regional coordinator of interests on local, regional and national level. This encompasses co-operation with different civil society organizations, regulatory authorities, development organizations or research entities. Since 2001,

RDC Koper act as regional development agency for eight Coastal-Karst municipalities: Ankaran, Divača, Hrpelje-Kozina, Izola, Komen, Koper, Piran and Sežana and it is in charged for preparation of the **joint development programme**.

Main focus of development programme is putted on areas of great importance, such are **economic development**, **rural development**, **sea**, **spatial planning and nature protection**, with a view to the sustainable development of protected areas. Region is covering **five protected areas** Landscape Park Strunjan, Škocjanski zatok Nature reserve, Sečovlje Salina Nature Park, The Škocjan caves, Lipica Stud Farm, and 60% of Natura 2000 areas. As the region is a unique and ecologically very sensitive area, a balance between economic interests, local population needs and environmental concerns is extremely important for a sustainable development.

RDC Koper implements different **cross-border and transnational projects**. Successfully implemented projects with their results are consistent with the objectives **of regional development programme**. Such project of regional and national interest was project CAMP Slovenia where was prepared Integrated Coastal Zone Management Programme for coastal areas, including maritime protected areas and strategies for sustainable development. Project with the similar objectives was also SHAPE (IPA Adriatic Programme). In the pilot area Landscape Park Strunjan were implemented tools for supporting MSP and ICZM Protocol.

RDC Koper currently employs 12 people, from different professional backgrounds: geography, architecture, communication, economy and transport studies. This year RDC Koper celebrated 25th anniversary. Over the two past decade, the collective efforts brought **considerable benefits to the citizens including mobility, increased economic development and better quality of life.** <u>More information</u>

WWF Adria, Croatia

As part of the WWF global network, WWF Adria was officially established in 2015 to work on the **sustainable management**



region, part of the larger iviediterranean and Danube-Carpathian ecoregion. Through its partner organizations, though, WWF Adria has been present in the region since the beginning of this century.

Its headquarters are located in Zagreb, Croatia. It carries out its work in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Kosovo*, Slovenia and Serbia, with more than 50 staff members. It **cooperates with more than 80 Protected Areas in the region**, helping them to

become a central part of the development of the region in which they need to be a driving force to enhance the quality of life of communities living in or around PAs in balance with the fundamental natural values.

WWF Adria focuses on **protecting and recovering key species**, **habitats and ecosystems**, with good governance systems in place, and enabling **sustainable management and equitable use of natural resources**. It works towards civil society that is informed, educated and empowered to engage in environmental stewardship and decision-making. It is trying to achieve change on the ground: connect local communities with their protected areas, encourage those areas to have better management plans and focus on sustainable, **low impact tourism**, inspire investors to choose sustainable hydropower, and people to recognize the values of the ecosystems that surround us and to seek out sustainable seafood.
