### **Initiating a European cultural route of reformation from the perspective of a regional (state) tourist association - 10 years of experience in the network Transromanica**

The cultural route of Romanesque was designed as a state project 25 years ago.

After 3 years of successful cooperation within an EU Interreg Project, the association of the transnational network Transromanica was founded.

1000 years of Romanesque heritage unites us in the European cultural area just as the 500 years of the history of the Reformation does. Collecting sites and testimonies from Romanesque times has the same impact on the shared spirit of Europe as gathered sites and testimonies of the history of reformation have.

The goal of a common European identification can only be achieved by connecting the shared cultural roots and by being aware of the shared development. At the same time, there must be respect and awareness for the individual regional history and its specific features.

The idea of a united Europe and the identification with it is really worth to fasten to common cultural roots. To realize this common history and evolution is as indispensable

as to be aware of and to be connected to our regional history and specific features simultaneously.
