1. Summary description of the pilot action explaining its experimental nature and demonstration character

At the start of the Hicaps project we had detailed planning phase that included analysis, studies and detailed design of renovation. Preparation phase included landscape design, planning planting specific plants, flowers, trees and small infrastructure works that were needed.

After that, we started reconstruction works.

Works done through the Hicaps project

- 5 signposts and 2 tablets providing better information to the visitors, described stories from the past, wildlife, photos
- restoration of the garden concerning vegetation, paths, antique fountain, irrigation.

Thanks to revitalization works, not only the historical layout and species composition of plants restored, but additionally, accessibility for people with physical disabilities increased through new surfaces. Properly prepared information boards allowed blind and visually impaired people to learn about the history of the foundation and the characteristic elements of this garden interior. In addition, the venture gained educational and natural value – increased the awareness of shaping historic gardens and parks throughout history. In this particular case, society will learn the elements of Polish typical time design, i.e. of the 20th century. It should be remembered that garden art is part of the historical consciousness of humanity. The combination of a revitalized Italian garden with architecture completed work of art and became an element of cultural and natural heritage.

The revitalization of the Italian garden took place on the basis of existing and available authentic historical documentation, which further emphasizes its unique character and take the viewer to such a wonderful thirties of the twentieth century.




The historic park of the Lubomirski and Potocki families is located in the center of Łańcut in the Podkarpackie Voivodeship. The whole complex is situated on a small hill, its area is 36 ha and it is divided into an internal garden (in the immediate vicinity of the Castle, framed by a moat) and an external park.


4. Description of the investment, including technical characteristics







- 5. Which horizontal principles did you take in consideration during preparation and implementation process (equal opportunities, non-discrimination, economic aspect, barrier –free accessibility)

For activities in HICAPS pilot project, special long term agreement with owner of the Castle of Łańcut was needed. During revitalization and construction works, special attention was paid to protect all trees, plants in park. When choosing materials for equipment in Park, we avoided materials with negative impact on environment.

- 1. All project activities have been carried out in accordance with national and EU legislation.
- 2. Our investment did not interfere negatively with the environment it involved minor changes in the park's landscape. That project will have positive affect on sustainable development of the program area and participating regions. Specially on further development on natural and cultural resources: new business opportunities in tourism sector.

The work was divided into parts. Some were part of other orders. Many dates were changed by Covid-19.

10. Ownership and durability of the investment (e.g. maintainences, financing)

THE OWNERSHIP OF THE SITE

The Łańcut Castle Museum is a cultural institution with legal personality run jointly by the Minister of Culture and National Heritage and the Podkarpackie Voivodeship, entered on January 1, 2006 under item 67/2006 into the Register of Cultural Institutions kept by the Minister of Culture and National Heritage.

RRDA and Muzeum-Park in Łańcut, on the basis of a long-term contract, have decided to:

The durability of the project will be maintained for a minimum of 5 years from the end of the project. However, the durability of the project will certainly remain preserved for many years to come as the completed tasks are to be used in a very long-term perspective.

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Sustainability will be continued and project results will be used after the end of the funding period.

Project partners and other entities can follow our idea as the preservation of tradition and history takes place for present and future generations.



Sustainability will be guaranteed by the immediate implementation of the new knowledge acquired through HICAPS, to feel the missing gaps and produced new services, usable for a long time. The plan will be used in revitalization concept and pilots, so it will be used by all the stakeholders involved in the HICAPS historical parks.

Transferability will be ensured through dissemination and already established partners network to transfer the outputs to other regions and cities in Poland and in Central Europe.

11. Expected impact and benefits of the pilot action for the concerned territory and target groups

Expected impact of the project is encourage an interest in history and cultural heritage in public especially tourists, young people and children. During the 3rd period of this project (IX 2018), we organized workshop for school children and present them HICAPS project. They learned about the importance of cultural and historical heritage the castle and the castle park. They were very pleased with presented information. We hope that they will remain interested in and visit the park more often in the future.

There are also a school, high school nearby the castle park. Kids are going for a walk every day, so now they can go in renovated park for a walk on pathway. They can learn something new, about history, castle, plants, discover Braille that is not in everyday use and of course, they can learn about HICAPS project. All listed information are printed on information tables. We know that children are curious, they learn guickly and habits they get, remain.

Through planning this project, particular attention was paid to provide access for people with disabilities in moving.

12.Lessons learned from the implementation of the pilot action

Thanks to international cooperation we gained:

- learning new organizational and technical solutions;
- getting know better partner's culture and the way how they protect cultural and historical heritage
- approaching problems, solutions and methods from a different perspective;
- the opportunity to develop a truly European way of thinking;

- increasing awareness and knowledge;



- the possibility of using ready-made solutions and "good practices" developed by transnational partners;
- experience in building and managing partnerships.

We had excellent cooperation with all partners and all possible support of Lead partner Municipality of Velenje.

13. Transferability to other territories and stakeholders

The park is part of the landscape of the region. It is a showcase of the region that attracts thousands of tourists from the country and abroad. Investments in the park, which were done through this project was in line with the level of the legal possibilities and at the same time harmonized and discussed with the relevant bodies.

The park will need to be keep sustainable in terms of regular gardening, in the Park work many qualified people, there are no plans to additional employment, or introduction of fees and tickets for visiting the park. The park is opened for public and visited by local population, tourists, school kids, families with kids, senior citizens, people with reduced mobility, etc.

The park is ready to share tips on implemented activities with other entities.

The park carries out many promotional and dissemination activities, incl. annual music festival

- The Music Festival in Łańcut has been taking place since 1961, presenting performances by leading performers from the world of classical music.
