Strengthening regional partnership in selected SPA regions in Upper Austria



Background

Upper Austria is supporting the formation of inter-municipal network structures on a regional level, which is responsible among others for the protection of natural resources adapted to regional conditions. The Mühlviertel region does not have a classic thermal region and its resources are based on several small radon-containing water sources. On the other hand, the Innviertel has a typical abundant thermal water reservoir, which is used by very different actors.

Main aim

To strengthen regional partnership to reach a better and sustainable capitalisation of the factor "natural heritage"
