



NEW APPROACHES FOR BETTER AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT







Air quality is often mostly regulated at the local level, but air pollution crosses local and international boundaries. AIR TRITIA treats air quality as a transnational issue by providing a unified spatial database and introducing new tools for controlling pollution. Supercomputers are employed in conducting detailed modelling of air quality, and project partners also elaborate legislative proposals for controlling pollution.

PROTECTING OUR ENVIRONMENT WITH GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE







Green infrastructure involves the use of natural and semi-natural landscape features to protect the environment and improve our quality of life by connecting urban, peri-urban and rural green spaces.

MaGICLandscapes provides management tools and knowledge that helps central European planners and communities take advantage of the many benefits of green infrastructure and identify opportunities to protect and enhance its functions. 




